EDUCATION SERVICES

The Center for Child Protection, a nationally accredited children's advocacy center, is the first stop for children in Travis County who are suspected victims of sexual abuse, physical abuse, and neglect and for children who have witnessed a violent crime. The Center is a child-friendly, specially-equipped facility where children go for recorded forensic interviews, medical exams, counseling and intervention during the investigation and prosecution of child abuse cases. It is the only nonprofit in Travis County involved in the investigation of crimes against children.

The Center's Education Services offers educational programs to professionals, parents and community organizations on identification, reporting and prevention of child abuse and neglect. The information can be tailored to your agency or group. These services are offered free of charge and are available in English and Spanish.

Child Abuse and Neglect Identification and Reporting | Time varies

Who Should Attend: Professionals who work with children

Objectives Include:

- Identifying the sign/symptoms of abuse,
- What to do if a child discloses abuse,
- How and when to report abuse, and
- What happens during the investigation.

Stewards of Children

Who Should Attend: Professionals, parents and any responsible adult who cares about the welfare of children, particularly appropriate for training staff and volunteers of youth-serving organizations.

Stewards of Children is a sexual abuse prevention training program that educates through a variety of training modules to prevent, recognize and react responsibly to child sexual abuse.

Stewards of Children Modules Include:

- Child Sexual Abuse Prevention | 2 - 3 hours
- Child Sexual Abuse and the Commercial Sexual Exploitation of Children | 1.5 hours
- Bystanders Protecting Children from Boundary Violations and Sexual Abuse | 1 hour
- Healthy Touch for Children and Youth | 1 hour
- Talking with Children About Safety from Sexual Abuse | 1 hour

Child Sexual Abuse: What Every Adult Should Know | Time varies

Who Should Attend: Parents, professionals and other adults

Objectives Include:

- Identifying behaviors and activities that perpetrators use to gain the trust of children and adults,
- Developing skills to recognize risks, and
- Learning to respond appropriately.

Internet Safety for Children & Families | 1.5 hours

Who Should Attend: Parents and caregivers

Objectives Include:

- Learning what aspects of the Internet children may be involved with,
- Understanding different threats encountered while on the Internet, and
- Implementing precautions to create a safe environment for children's online interactions.

Effective Discipline and Building Self-Esteem for Parents and Caregivers | 1 - 1.5 hours

Who Should Attend: Parents and caregivers

Objectives Include:

- Identifying effective techniques for disciplining children in a positive manner, and
- Promoting the development of self-esteem for children.
