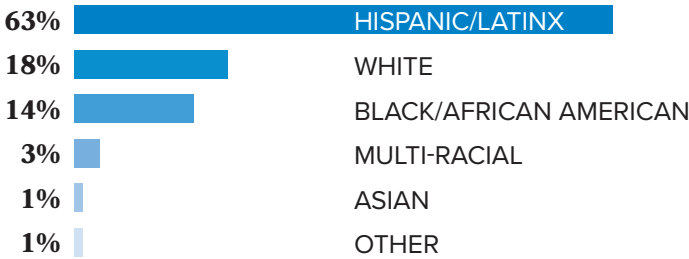
CENTER FOR CHILD PROTECTION

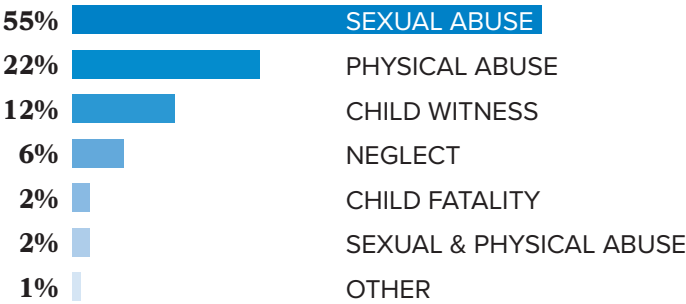
In 2023, the Center for Child Protection served:

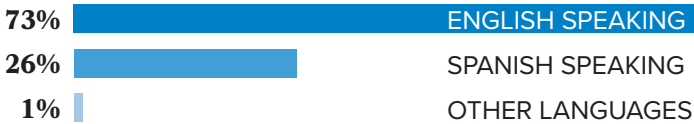

- 1 a **non-leading, developmentally sensitive method** of gathering information from an alleged child victim of physical abuse, sexual abuse, neglect, or the witness of a violent crime; recorded and conducted in a legally defensible manner by a **specially trained, unbiased professional**; observed by case workers, law enforcement, district attorneys and other staff assigned to the case to protect the **integrity of the information and thoroughly assess child safety issues** and possible criminal offenses

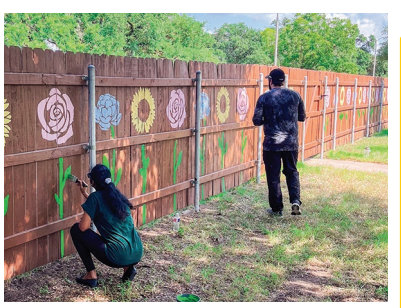
