



1 a non-leading, developmentally sensitive method of gathering information from an alleged child victim of physical abuse, sexual abuse, neglect, or the witness of a violent crime; recorded and conducted in a legally defensible manner by a specially trained, unbiased professional; observed by case workers, law enforcement, district attorneys and other staff assigned to the case to protect the integrity of the information and thoroughly assess child safety issues and possible criminal offenses
