

In 2024, the Center for Child Protection served:





facilitation of a multi-disciplinary task force called the Child Protective Team, comprising of local law enforcement, the Department of Family and Protective Services, the Travis County District Attorney's Office, Dell Children's Medical Center, and the Center for Child Protection; this team is designed to facilitate agile responses to cases of child abuse by meeting regularly to share pertinent case information and develop ways to support victims and their families
